### **Presentation on Athletic Facilities**

Mike Lenz from Fanning Howey gave a presentation of options for renovation of the Athletic Facilities in the school district. The proposal kept the same basic footprint for Herrnstein Field with more parking space behind Smith, new seating for 3,000 people, new ticket booths and concession stands, new restrooms, a larger building for locker room, weight room, storage and meeting rooms. The estimated cost for the renovations and additions to Herrnstein Field is \$7.1 million. The proposal also includes wish list items such as synthetic turf for the football field and additional seating for \$1.9 million.

The renovation of McVicker Field at Mt. Logan would include adding a varsity baseball field, a varsity soccer field, a varsity softball field, 5 tennis courts, a 500 seat grandstand, additional parking and a walking trail around the perimeter of the grounds to replace the track that will be removed. The estimated cost for the improvements is \$3.7 million.

The Board thanked Fanning Howey and the Athletic Facility Committee for their hard work. This information will be taken back to the committee for review and future planning including how to fund the projects.
